FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR:

In this Sunday’s Gospel reading, we are introduced to the “Office of the Keys”. The ‘keys’ are given to the Church by Christ in order for the locking of heaven to the unrepentant and the unlocking of heaven for the repentant sinner. The office of the pastor (holy ministry) is set aside in the Church and specifically given to men who have been ordained. This office extends to others who serve in auxiliary capacities such as: teachers, deacons/deaconesses, DCE’s, Altar Guild, Acolytes, and many others who serve (organists, secretaries, choir directors, etc.). Each of these auxiliary positions carry a certain responsibility to assist the pastor in an orderly and decent conduct of the Worship Service.

Acolytes have been duly trained and have been given a booklet called the “Acolyte Guide”. This booklet (available upon request) was designed by me, the pastor, so that we can have a better understanding of this most important role of the Acolyte. The booklet is simple in design and addresses such things as color of the robe, names of the items used (torches and wicks), and basic duties of the Acolyte. The most specific duty is the ‘Lighting’ and ‘Extinguishing’ of the candles. In the past, the candles have been lit from bottom to top and extinguished in reverse order, BUT since the adoption of the “Lutheran Service Book” (LSB), a new method has been prescribed in order to match the “Divine Service” as spelled out in a book entitled “Gathered Guests - A Guide to Worship in the Lutheran Church”.

As the Acolytes light the candles from the top to the bottom, they are calling the congregation to see fire (God) coming down from heaven - a picture of God coming to serve us in the Worship Service with His Sacraments. It is also a picture of a book being opened as God comes to us in His Word. As we close the service, we are offering ourselves to God as we lift up our hearts and our service to others. And so, the Acolytes ‘close the book’ by extinguishing from bottom to top lighting their torches from the highest (closest to God) candle. The Acolytes then take the fire out of the Church symbolizing the end of God’s service to us and the beginning of our service to Him as we take the light of Christ into the world.

PREPARING FOR CHURCH THIS SUNDAY

In today’ Gospel reading from Matthew, we have the confession of St. Peter and three promises made by Jesus. Peter’s confession, “You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God” is praised by Jesus not because Peter (flesh and blood) has revealed this, but ONLY the Father in heaven has. When Peter acts on his own, he fails (sinks in the water, scolded by Jesus, etc) and Jesus says that he has ‘little’ faith. BUT now Peter is speaking on God’s authority and he is blessed by Jesus and receives a new name - *Petros, the rock*.

The three promises of Jesus all deal with His Church: 1) Christ will build His Church on this Rock, 2) The Gates of Hades will not prevail over it, and 3) Jesus gives the “keys” to the Kingdom to His Church. *What Does This Mean?* 1) Peter becomes a great leader in the Church, but Christ builds His Church on this confession of Peter who speaks on behalf of the other disciples and the Church. 2) We are at war, not with each other nor other denominations, but against the *Evil One* and his legions. 3) The Church has the authority to forgive and retain sin. Because of Apostolic succession, an ordained pastor speaks on behalf of Christ Himself to absolve you of your sins upon your sincere confession.

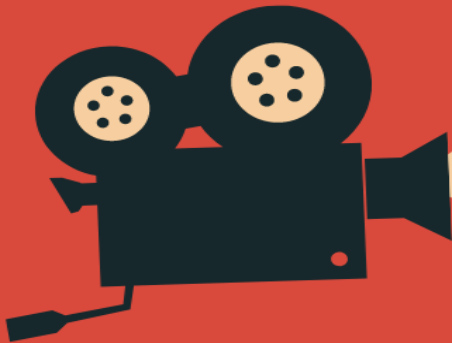

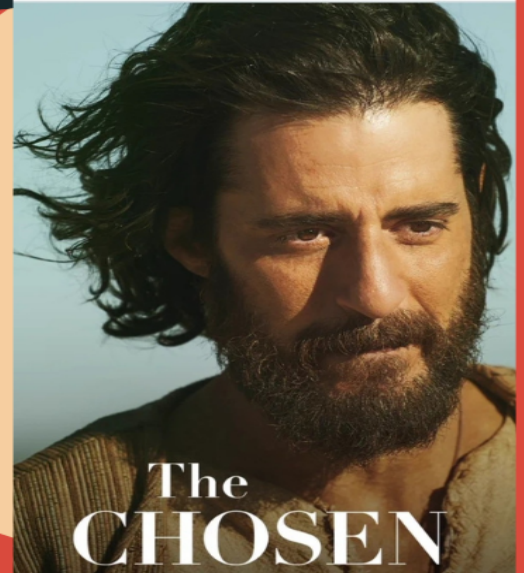

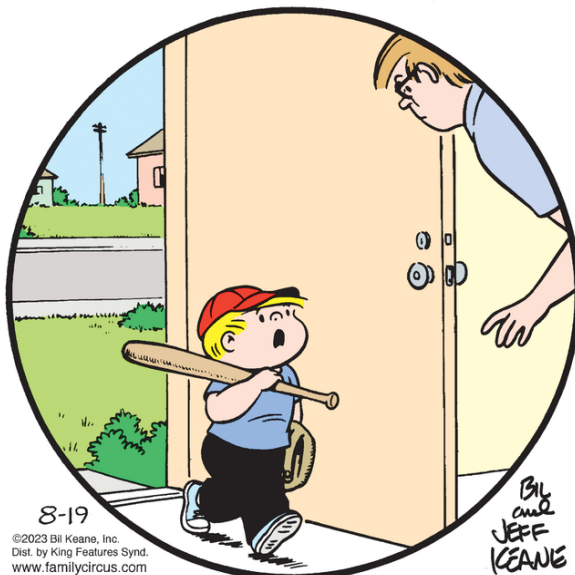

Define Your Life by How You Give

Winston Churchill reportedly said that “we make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give.” According to Churchill, our lives are defined not by what we have gotten, but by what we give away.

Our Lord’s life is defined in this way. He gave completely of Himself for us. He became man for us. He taught the truth of God’s Word. He healed those with many and various diseases. He died the death that we deserved for our sins. He gave of Himself in order to save us from sin, death and hell. And so it is that by giving completely of Himself, He got for Himself us, making us citizens of His eternal kingdom by grace.

As it was for Jesus, so it also is for us. We get more from giving than we do from simply getting. For giving softens our hearts and frees us from the grip which the worries of this world and making a living has on us. For when we are singularly focused on making a living, we are singularly focused on what we get. That mindset begins to bleed into all areas of our lives — our relationships with friends and family, with neighbors and coworkers, and with the Lord. It shifts our focus from asking the question, “How can I be a friend, family member, neighbor and servant to others,” to asking the question, “What have they done for me lately?” We become more selfish instead of selfless.

But when we give, we do not have less, we do not become less; rather, we have more and become more. When we give, we join in the bond of friendship and family, the bond of service to those around us out of love for them. And love is the fulfillment of the Law. It is the nature of God Himself, for God is Love. Thus, we are participating in the divine nature. As Jesus said, “It is more blessed to give than to receive” (Acts 20:35).

Tomorrow’s Teachers & Preachers Celebrations Begin

Rev. Steve Resner of Immanuel Lutheran in Honey Creek says it was “a given” that he’d be a Lutheran church worker—either as a teacher or a pastor. As of June of 2023, he can now say he’s done both! After 36 years of teaching at a Lutheran school—24 of those years at Trinity Lutheran in Jefferson City—he was ordained and installed this summer as Immanuel’s pastor.

Professional church work vocations are actually commonplace in the Resner Family. In fact, there’s more than one Pastor Resner in the Missouri District! On the day of Steve’s ordination, the preacher was one he knew well—his son, Rev. Matthew Resner of Zion in Moberly.

As is our custom each fall, the Missouri District celebrates *Tomorrow’s Teachers & Preachers*—the annual campaign to raise awareness of church work vocations and bolster financial support for those preparing to enter these roles. For more than 40 years, the Missouri District Student Aid Endowment has provided scholarships for students attending both seminaries and the Concordia University System.

Matthew Resner was a District scholarship recipient years ago and describes what it meant to him: “Without the support of those around me, I would’ve never made it to where I am. 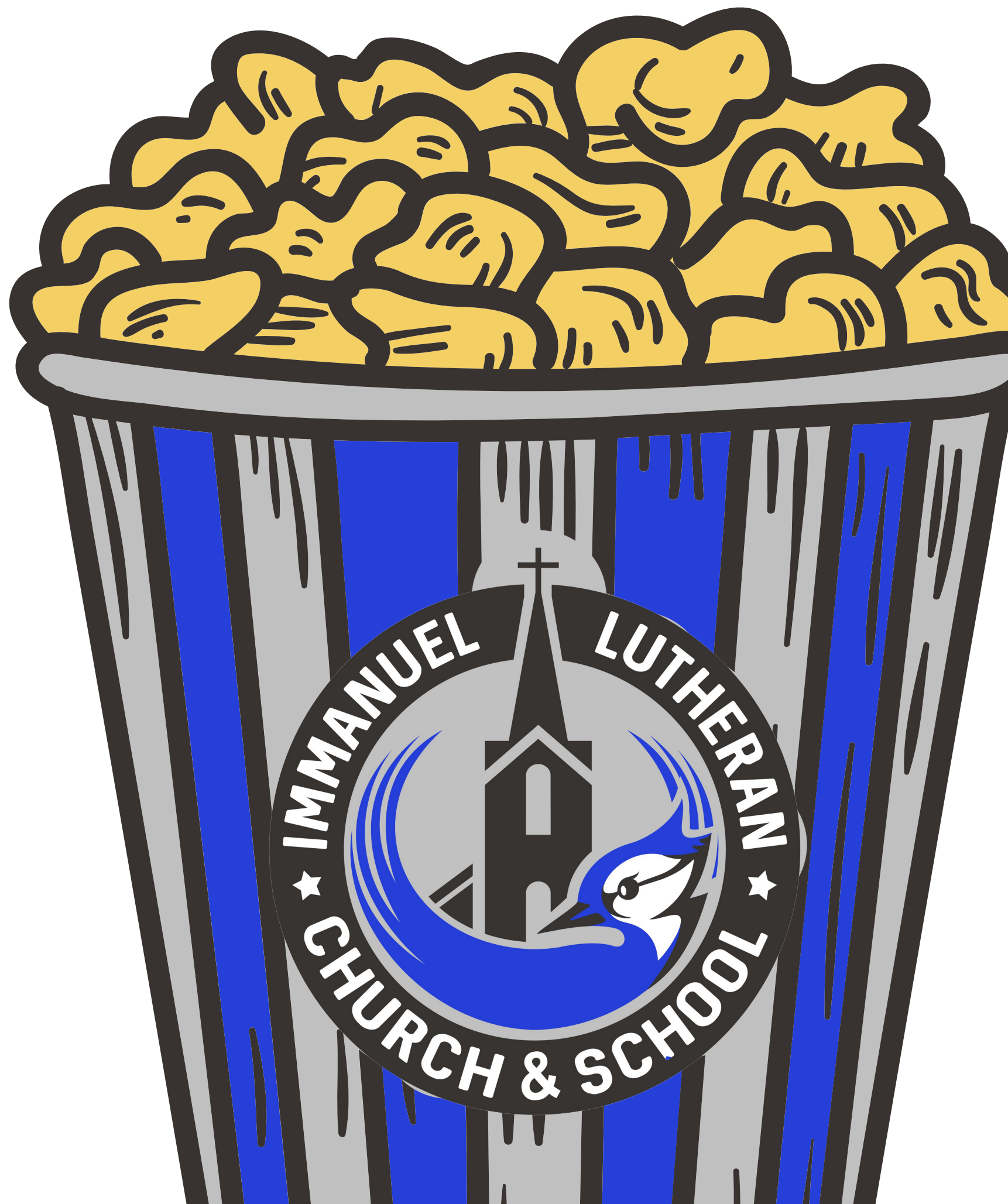
