The murdering of God's creation, human life - the best





Blast From The Past: Here at Honey Creek we love and are proud of our History. Periodically we will be posting bulletins from the past, thanks to Paul and Frances Sommerer, who saved them all those years ago. Hope you enjoy and find an article about someone you remember or even yourself. This Week is two different bulletins from September and November of 1946.

BULLETIN-INDANUEL LUTHERAN CONGREGATION, HONEY CREEK, 10.-SEPT. 24, 1946

I have purchased our former pastor's duplicating machine and a type-writer, and will attempt to issue a bulletin from time to time to keep the members informed of the happenings in the congregation.-C.W.T.

Divine services will be conducted by the vacancy pastor, Rev. Schmaltz, every Sunday at 2:30 P.M. Sunday School will begin at 1:45. During Sunday School, the confirmation class will meet with Rev. Schmaltz in the school to take instructions.

A congregational meeting was held Sept. 22 for the purpose of calling a pastor. Five candidates were put on the list to be voted on Sept.29. Four of them were suggested by Western District President Roschke, and one was added by the congregation. Their names are: Rev. Medler from Chicago, out of office for several years—has to move out of his home within a month—former missionary at large; Rev. Wein from New Melle, Mo., teaches and preaches now—wears an earphone; Rev. Dierker from South Gate, California, doing work in Army and Navy hospitals; Rev. Buerger from Memphis, Tenn., former chaplain; Rev. Pragman from St. Joseph, Mo. All the pastors are around 50 yrs. old, except Rev. Pragman, who is about 35. All are able to preach German. The salary of the prospective pastor was set at \$1500 by a vote of 39 to 3.
