FROM THE DESK OF YOUTH AND FAMILY MINISTRY DIRECTOR

It is time for Sunday School to begin, and we are looking forward to another great year! We have classes for kids of all ages. Sunday School classes have been around for a long time, but our goal remains the same. Our goal is to share God's Word, so the children can hear both Law and Gospel, and come together to connect and grow in their faith.

We will kick off the year with our Sunday School Rally on September 10th, from 8:15-9:15 am in the commons. We will have a Bible lesson, Sam the Puppet, donuts, game, craft, and more! All families are invited. Kids, preschool-5th grade are welcome to participate. Those of youth group age are encouraged to help me with serving donuts, craft, and games.

The first day for Sunday School classes is Sunday, September 17th. Classes will last from 8:15-9:15 am. We have some wonderful teachers who have agreed to teach this year. The following are the classroom and teacher assignments. We will meet in the kindergarten room to sing a couple of songs each Sunday before dismissing into classrooms. Preschool - Kindergarten students (with teacher, Amy Kopp) will stay in the kindergarten room, 1st-2nd grade students (with teacher, Jenna Dick) will meet in 1st-2nd grade classroom, 3rd-5th grade students (with teachers, Sonja and Lucas Bechel) will meet in 3rd-4th grade classroom, and youth group aged kids, both Jr. and Sr. High (with various teachers) will meet in the 5th-6th grade classroom.

There will be a special dedication and blessing for all of the Sunday School teachers on Sunday, September 10th, during our worship service.

Parents are welcome to attend the Adult Bible Study (commons) or the Mom's Bible Study (youth room) while kids are in Sunday School. Our Mom's Bible Study group will resume meeting on Sunday, September 17th. We also have several youth group girls who have agreed to babysit those too young for Sunday School in the preschool classroom.

PREPARING FOR CHURCH THIS SUNDAY

LUTHERANS OF COLE COUNTY - JEREMY AMICK

We would like to invite your congregation to join us at the Parish of St. John's Lutheran Church in Stringtown **at 3 p.m. on Sunday, September 24, 2023**. Local author and historian Jeremy Amick will share some of the history of Lutheran immigration to Cole County as documented in his upcoming book "Lutherans of Cole County, Missouri: A History." The St. John's Ladies' Aid will be providing refreshments at this event. Additionally, your congregation is featured in this presentation.

Large groups of German immigrants began arriving in Cole County in the 1830s. By 1843, thirty-seven of them had banded together to establish the first Lutheran church in the county: Zion Church. The following year, the second Lutheran church was founded near Taos, while the pastors at Zion helped establish a third congregation in Lohman in the 1850s.

Doctrinal disputes inspired members to leave the church in Lohman and establish a new Lutheran congregation in Stringtown after the Civil War. Over the generations, Zion—the "Mother Church"—disbanded, but other Lutheran congregations developed in Centertown, Honey Creek, Russellville, Jefferson City and near Brazito.


Mid-Week Bible Study

Define Your Life by How You Give

Winston Churchill reportedly said that "we make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give." According to Churchill, our lives are defined not by what we have gotten, but by what we give away.

Our Lord's life is defined in this way. He gave completely of Himself for us. He became man for us. He taught the truth of God's Word. He healed those with many and various diseases. He died the death that we deserved for our sins. He gave of Himself in order to save us from sin, death and hell. And so it is that by giving completely of Himself, He got for Himself us, making us citizens of His eternal kingdom by grace.

As it was for Jesus, so it also is for us. We get more from giving than we do from simply getting. For giving softens our hearts and frees us from the grip which the worries of this world and making a living has on us. For when we are singularly focused on making a living, we are singularly focused on what we get. That mindset begins to bleed into all areas of our lives — our relationships with friends and family, with neighbors and coworkers, and with the Lord. It shifts our focus from asking the question, "How can I be a friend, family member, neighbor and servant to others," to asking the question, "What have they done for me lately?" We become more selfish instead of selfless.

But when we give, we do not have less, we do not become less; rather, we have more and become more. When we give, we join in the bond of friendship and family, the bond of service to those around us out of love for them. And love is the fulfillment of the Law. It is the nature of God Himself, for God is Love. Thus, we are participating in the divine nature. As Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).

After 36 years of teaching at a Lutheran school—24 of those years at Trinity Lutheran in Jefferson City—he was ordained and installed this summer as Immanuel's pastor.
