FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

"The Chosen" is a film series that has caught a lot of attention in Christian circles. We have decided to show this series as part of our 'Family Movie Nights'. I highly encourage you to come and watch with us. If you cannot make these 'movie nights', we have the series on DVD or you can stream the series on a number of streaming services.

I want to offer some advice on how to watch this series. First, you need to realize this is not Holy Scripture. It is not intended to replace or become the Bible. Second, this series is intended to tell the story of Scripture from a first person perspective of the Disciples and the followers of Jesus. Much of the dialogue is added to the text of the Scriptures and as such, the dialogue is trying to unfold the story. Third, the characters may or may not be how you would picture them, but don't let that distract you from the story. Portraying Jesus is the hardest because the actor is only human. Fourth, let the story unfold before you for several episodes before you pass judgment on it. It takes time for the characters to develop and the story to unfold. And finally, the richest thing to take away from this series is the Jewish traditions, ceremonies, and customs that help us understand the world in which Jesus lived. There is much good in this series as it is intended to make the Scriptures come alive and the story to become more real for us.

PREPARING FOR CHURCH THIS SUNDAY

The Gospel reading for this week is all about forgiveness. The first part is Peter asking how many times we must forgive. Peter offers a very generous number of times - seven. Afterall, he reasons, seven is quite generous and it is the traditional number of perfection. But Jesus tells him that we must forgive seventy times seven. In other words, we are to be unlimited in the number of times we forgive.

The second part of this reading further expands this "Unlimited Forgiveness". Jesus tells the parable of the "Unforgiving Servant". A slave owed his master 1000 years of wages and begs for mercy. His master unbelievably grants him pardon. The slave finds another slave who owes him four months wages. The slave who had been forgiven by his master then chokes his fellow slave and has him thrown into prison. When the master learns about this slave, he has him thrown into jail to be tortured and calls him wicked. And Jesus delivers some 'chilling' words to us if we cannot forgive - "So also my heavenly Father will do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother from your heart."





Stewardship in the First Commandment

The greatest gift that Martin Luther gave to us was his Small Catechism. The word "enchiridion" is part of the original title of this work. This is the Greek word for "handbook." The Small Catechism is a handbook of the Bible. All the basic knowledge that a Christian needs to understand the faith and live a godly life has been taken from the Bible and distilled into this beautiful little book of Christian piety.

Luther starts with the Ten Commandments.

The First Commandment: You shall have no other gods. What does this mean? We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things. (SC I)

We have a God above us. He is the Lord God and we are not. He is Almighty and in control. He is righteous and good. And therefore, we should fear Him.

This God is also our heavenly Father. He wants us to be saved. He does not want us to suffer His just wrath. He has provided salvation for us in His Son, Jesus Christ. And therefore, we should love Him.

Our heavenly Father will never leave us nor forsake us. He has promised as much — and the Bible shows us that He always keeps His promises. So, we should trust Him.

In the Large Catechism, Luther explains how money and possessions form one of the greatest temptations against the First Commandment:

This I must unfold somewhat more plainly, that it may be understood and perceived by ordinary examples of the contrary. Many a one thinks that he has God and everything in abundance when he has money and possessions; he trusts in them and boasts of them with such firmness and assurance as to care for no one. Lo, such a man also has a god, Mammon by name, i.e., money and possessions, on which he sets all his heart, and which is also the most common idol on earth. He who has money and possessions feels secure, and is joyful and undismayed as though he were sitting in the midst of Paradise. On the other hand, he who has none doubts and is despondent, as though he knew of no God. For very few are to be found who are of good cheer, and who neither mourn nor complain if they have not Mammon. This [care and desire for money] sticks and clings to our nature, even to the grave. (LC I 5–9)

These words of Dr. Luther should call us to repentance; sometimes, we live and act like we don't have a Father in heaven. We seek our comfort and peace outside of His gracious promises. But we do have a Father in heaven. He does love us. All His promises are true. And the Lord will surely provide. If that is our belief, then our outward lives will reflect our belief in our acts of generosity and mercy. We will see money and possessions not as gods but rather as tools for doing God's work.
