We are happy that you are with us to hear the Word of God and His Gifts.

Holy Communion at Immanuel

This note is for guests, family, and friends who attend as visitors and have not been in table fellowship with us. We are blessed to have you in attendance with us and pray that you would seek to learn more about our practices.

Holy Communion is the fulfillment of the whole Service and the greatest mystery of our faith. We process to the Altar and remain standing. Upon being welcomed by the Pastor or Elder, it is proper to bow as a heartfelt worship of the God who manifests Himself in the sacred vessels of the Holy Eucharist. (It is also proper to bow before leaving the Altar.)

If you are not a member of the LCMS or of a church body in full, formal, fellowship with the LCMS, or have not been in table fellowship with us, we ask that you please abstain from eating and drinking the Body and Blood of Christ with us today. This is not meant in any way as a judgment on your faith, nor status as a Christian, nor a reflection upon your salvation. Rather, it merely acknowledges the real, sorrowful, schisms that persist among the various Christian denominations to this day. We pray God would end the schisms and that ALL Christians may one day have full, formal, unity. Until that day, however, this is our lamentable reality.

If you wish to come to the Altar for a blessing, you are most welcome to do so. Please cross your arms over your chest to indicate that you are not communing, but desire a blessing. The Pastor will gladly bless you with JOY in the Holy Spirit. If you desire to learn more about our practice of Holy Communion, we invite you to contact the church office to speak with the Pastor.

PREPARING FOR CHURCH

The fourth Sunday of Easter is 'Good Shepherd' Sunday. Jesus said, "I AM the Good Shepherd." In the Gospel of John, we have 7 "I AM" statements from Jesus. Each of them begins with 'I AM'. John is telling us that Jesus is the Great 'I AM' of the Old Testament. He is *Yahweh* in the flesh. But there is more to the story. In the original Greek, John uses this phrasing *-'Ego Emi*'. Each of these words are translated as 'I AM'. By doubling up, John is telling us in no uncertain terms that this Jesus is 'I AM who I AM' who is from the beginning.

Jesus is the 23rd Psalm in the flesh. He feeds us the 'green pastures' of His Word. He leads us to the 'still waters' in Holy Baptism. We walk 'through the valley of the shadow of death' as we pass from this earth to heaven. His 'rod and staff' are His Law and Gospel to teach and direct us. His 'prepared table' is Holy communion. 'Goodness and Mercy' is His love and compassion coming into the flesh to redeem us in our flesh.
